items. The children then go and find them with possible hotter/colder clues if needed. The winner has			
the most amount of the items.

□ Board games *			
Basic Board games and board games to be brought in like board game friday			
□ Memory game variation			
Using the new resource of the memory game, purchased from Hornsby, children attempt to memorize			
where the items are and match them. If you get a match you keep that and the winner has the most			
matches at the conclusion.			
□ Make your own bridge			
Using assorted materials children are instructed to design a bridge. If they want they can test them by			
pushing toy cars over them to see if they function.			
□ Card houses			
Children attempt to stack cards into a pyramid shape. The aim is to create the tallest pyramid without it			
falling.			
□ Pretend Hospital			
Children practice caring for the sick by emulating a hospital. We have several useful dress ups and can			
allow children to use some medical supplies such as band-aids.

□ Chalk drawings

Allow children to use chalk on either the path outside Noosh or the chalk boards (no window chalk if on the path) to create a picture or design of their choice.

Active instructions				
Soccer	Soccer is a game played by 2 teams of players with their feet. The object is to hit the ball into the goal. The only player who can touch the ball with their hands are the goalkeepers.			
Capture the flag	two teams each have a <u>flag</u> (or other marker) and the objective is to capture the other team's flag, located at the team's "base," and bring it safely back to their own base. Enemy players can be "tagged" by players in their home territory and, depending on the rules, they may be out of the game, become members of the opposite team, sent back to their own territory, or frozen in place ("in jail") until freed by a member of their own team.			
Handball	Children stand in their square and hit the ball so it bounces in their square and then another.			
Obstacle Course	a course through which the participants must run, negotiating obstacles to be climbed, crawled under, crossed on suspended ropes, etc., as used for training soldiers.			
Spotlight	The person who is "it" waits at the "jail" counting to a high number while everyone else hides. Then, armed with a flashlight, this person searches for the others who may be switching hiding spots.			

44 Home	This is a hide-and-seek game. The players do 'Twenty-one' to find who is 'It'. 'It' hides his face against the padded goal post and counts up to 44 while the others hide. When 'It' finds someone he must run and touch the base and say 'Forty-four home' before the other player reaches it.

## **DIY Paper Spinners**


## Materials:

- Paper
- Card
- String
- o Pens
- Scissors
- Glue stick

## Steps

- Either print out two circles from the templates
   (https://www.redtedart.com/wp-content/uploads/2016/06/Paper-Spinning-Toy-blank-templates.pdf)
- Colour in your circles any way you wish. The colours will "mix" on any concentric circles. (see video for the effect). Be bold and
  experiment with different designs and patterns.
- Cut our your circles.
- o Stick the first circle on some cardboard.
- Cut out the cardboard circle now.
- Stick the second circle on to the back.
- Make two small holes (approx 1cm apart, if not 8mm) on either side of the centre of the circle the templates have markings for this.
- Thread string approx 40cm in length through and tie.





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#### Turtle Craft for Kids

- Paint (green)
- Paint brush
- Pipe cleaner (green)
- Pom Pom (green)
- Googly eyes
- Glue
- Rock from outside or bark (shell component)









#### Steps

#### **Step #1:**

Paint your rock or bark with the green paint. Set it aside to dry. (Apply a second coat if it needs it).

#### **Step #2:**

Bend your pipe cleaner into a star shape. Make one point of the star a little smaller, this will be his tail. Set this aside to be glued on the shell once the paint dries.

#### Step #3:

Grab your green pom pom. This will be your turtles head. Glue your two googly eyes onto the pom pom. Set it aside to be glued on the shell once it is dry.

#### **Step #4:**

Check on your shell, once it is dry it is time to start gluing! Glue the star shape you made onto the bottom. This will be his four legs and tail.

#### **Step #5:**

Glue the pom pom head onto the end opposite the pipe cleaner tail.

## Caterpillar pegs

#### Materials

- Wooden pegs
- Small pom poms
- Googly eyes
- Craft glue/woodglue

## Steps

- 1. Have children select their pom poms that they want to use
- 2. Write name on the bottom of the peg
- 3. Have students apply glue to one side of the peg
- 4. Stick the pom poms to the peg.
- 5. Stick eyes to the front pom pom
- 6. Leave to dry
