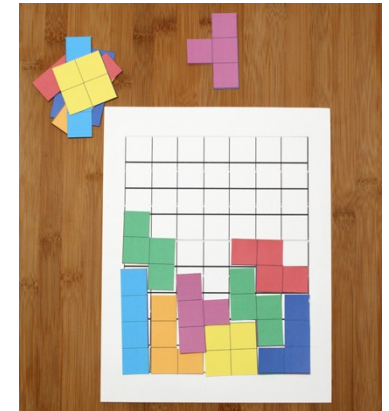
## Ball Throwing Categories Game

Paper grid

- - Paper Tetris shapes
1. Get children to cut out the shapes

## Snail Poster/Craft

- Paper
  - Pencils
  - Textas
1. Get children to draw a picture of a snail
  2. They can write fun facts they have learnt/know about snails  
Here are some facts you can tell them:

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- They can be split into three categories: land snails, sea snails and freshwater snails
- Most snail species have a ribbon-like tongue called a radula that contains thousands of microscopic teeth. The radula works like a file, ripping food up into tiny pieces.
- The giant African land snail grows to about 38 cm (15 in) and weigh 1 kg (2lb)
- The majority of snails are herbivores eating vegetation such as leaves, stems and flowers, some larger species and marine based species can be predatory omnivores or even carnivores
- Depending on the species snails can live 5 - 25 years

## Obstacle Course

- Balls
- Hoola hoops
- Skipping ropes
- Hurdles

1. Place equipment in an obstacle course layout.
2. Get the children to complete it teams (two identical courses and race) or get children to individually complete.

## Create Your Own Superhero

- Paper
- Pencils
- Textas

1. Get children to create their own superhero. Give it a name, design a costume and their special talent.
2. Draw and write a small blurb about their superhero

## Crab Soccer

- Soccer ball

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1. Divide the group into two teams with two goalies.
2. Explain the crab position (both hands and feet touching the ground, with stomachs toward the ceiling/sky)
3. Only movement in the crab position is allowed for the entire game.
4. Players can only kick or hit the ball with their feet and/or head; no hands are allowed.
5. The leader drops the ball in the centre of the field for a kick-off to begin the game, as well as after each point is scored.
6. Each team is trying to put the ball into the opposing team's goal.
7. If the ball goes out of bounds, the leader throws it back into play.

## Watercolour Flowers

- Watercolour paint palette
- Uncoated paper plates
- Brushes (If using watercolours)
- Stapler or glue
- Markers, chalk markers, crayons or oil pastels (for added embellishments)

1. Cut out flower petal shapes.
  - Begin by cutting multiple flower shapes from paper plates in decreasing sizes.
2. Staple or glue petals together.
  - Next, staple or glue them together in the centre.
3. Paint with watercolours.
  - Now paint the flower petals & stems with watercolour paint.
4. Add additional decorations!
  - Finally, if you like, embellish your flowers with additional drawings before or after painting them. We used chalk markers over the dried paint, which created a lovely effect.
