Pipe Cleaner Beading Ornaments

- Pipe-cleaners
- Beads
- Scissors
- 1. Get children to decide on shape (love-heart or snow-flake are suggested)
- 2. If picking snowflake, prepare pipe cleaners by:
 - Cutting 3 pipe cleaners in half. Fold these pipe cleaners in half again. Begin to twist two of these together on the bend. Then attach/twist the final pipe cleaners around the first two.
 - Then get the children to place beads on the pipe cleaners. Encourage them to think about/incorporate maths (counting, patterns by colour, patterns by quantity).
 - Finish the snowflake by curling the end of the pipe cleaner and placing it inside the hole of the last pipe cleaner.
- 3. If picking love heart, prepare pipe cleaners by:
 - Folding the pipe cleaner in half, making a crease.
 - Gently curve the sides to make the shape of a heart. Leave the ends open to allow the beads to be threaded on.
 - Then get the children to place beads on the pipe cleaners. Encourage them to think about/incorporate maths (counting, patterns by colour, patterns by quantity).
 - Once they have filled the cleaner, twist the top ends together to seal the heart. You can reshape it if you need.
