Resources needed:

- Flour
- Baby oil

Resources needed:

Jumbo sidewalk chalk (check out your local dollar store too) a tree branch (rocks work great too)

All you need is a sizable tree branch, like you see in the pics, and some jumbo sidewalk chalk, which you can find at most dollar stores. And some water.

I would recommend starting off with the dry chalk and let your kids rub it back and forth on the branch. Different textures and surfaces on the branch will offer different experiences with the chalk. Kids just love it.


After a little time with dry chalk painting (go as long as they seem engaged) offer a small bowl of water for dipping the chalk. Wet chalk will offer a whole new sensory experience that kids love even more. They will dip and dunk the chalk and paint paint all over the branch.

The colors look really different between the wet and dry chalk. It's really interesting to see.

Tuesday PM

Orbeez stress balls (SS)

- Orbeez
- Water
- Large bowl
- Funnel
- Empty plastic bottle
- Clear balloons
- 1. Pour a generous amount of Orbeez into a large bowl.
- 2. Fill the bowl with water and let it sit overnight. In the morning, you should be rewarded with a pile of bright, squishy water beads.
- 3. Use a funnel to fill the empty plastic bottle with Orbeez.
- 4. Blow up the balloon to create space for the Orbeez, then twist the opening to keep the air from escaping.
- 5. Stretch the balloon opening over the top of the plastic bottle.
- 6. Let the balloon untwist, then turn the bottle upside-down to pour the Orbeez into the balloon.
- 7. Remove the balloon from the bottle, squeeze out the extra air and tie it off.

Steps


- 1. Have children cut out strips from the sponges

Mask template Cardboard Feathers Coloured paper


Photcopy mask template below. Children will trace mask shape onto cardboard. They will then cut these out and decorate them. Elastic can be fastened to the edges, then left to dry!

Stained glass animals (SS)

- Black construction paper
- Clear contact paper
- Tissue paper in a variety of colors
- Scissors
- 1. Draw and then cut out the animal template from black paper.
- 2. Cut out the middle of the animal leaving approximately 1/2" of the outside intact. Discard the center you just cut out.
- 3. Peel the backing paper off of the contact paper and stick your animal outline onto it. Cut the excess contact paper off.
- 4. Cut a small circle out of black construction paper and stick it on the contact paper for the eye.
- 5. Cut a small curved shape out of black construction paper and stick it on the contact paper for a smile.
- 6. Stick the tissue paper onto the fish making sure to overlap the pieces.
- 7. Trim off any tissue paper that hangs over the black outline of the fish.
- 8. Hang up on a sunny window.

Step 3 Using a fork, give the oil and food colouring mixture a good mix to break up the 'colour beads' into smaller ones


Step 4 Carefully pour the oil & food colouring mixture into the glass of warm water and wait for the magic to happen!

Friday PM

Twirligig paper spinner (SS)

- paper (we used this colored paper)
- long wooden skewers
- Glue (both a glue stick and a hot glue gun
- 1. Cut 8 strips of paper. I cut it from the long side of the paper, 11 inches long. They are just over 1/2 inch in width. I used 8 different colors to make it rainbow and colorful. But you can do it all from one piece of paper, too!
- 2. You will also need to cut 4 circles for attaching the paper strips. My circles are a 1 1/2 inches in diameter.
- 3. Start by rubbing glue from a glue stick all over one of the circles. Arrange one end of the paper strips evenly around the circle. Keep adding glue as they overlap around the circle. Cover the top with another circle to secure them in place.

4. Now you will do the same with another circle. This time bring the other ends of the paper strips up and attach them to the circle. Once they are all attached with glue, cover again with another circle to secure them.

- 5. Now you are going to put the wooded skewer through the center of both circles of paper. I started the hole with a pin, then pushed the pointy end of the skewer up through the center of the paper spinner.
- 6. On the top circle, cover the top with hot glue to keep it from moving.
- 7. Reach the glue gun in to the under side of that top circle and add some hot glue there, too. This will keep the whole top section from moving as the spinner toy spins.
- 8. The bottom hole will need to be stretched out just a little bit. Just move the skewer around in the hole to make it a little wider. This will allow it to spin freely.
