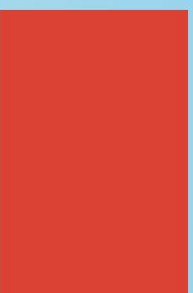

Draw a line to match the correct beach flag to the correct description.

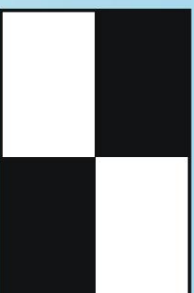
- **Water Sports area**

- Beware of winds blowing out to sea



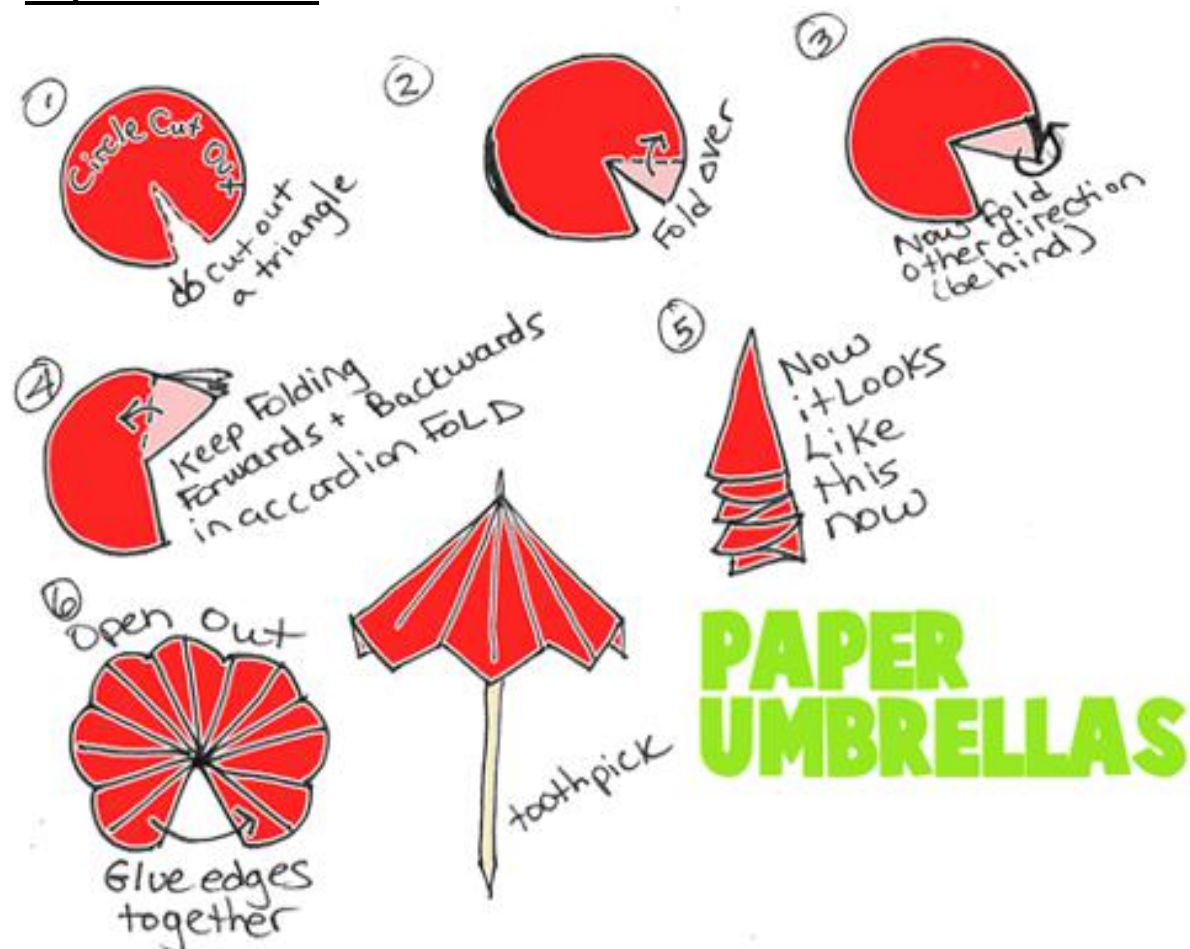
- **Dangerous area**

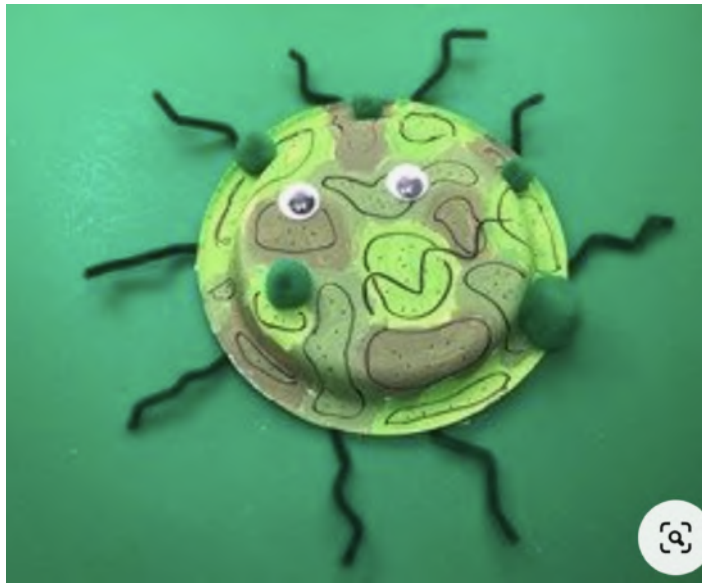
Germ puppets

Resources

- Coloured paper/cardboard
- Paddle pop sticks
- Googley eyes
- Glue sticks
- Scissors
- Textas/crayons
- Anything else to decorate, eg pipe cleaners, pom poms

Instructions

- Cut out shape from card
- Glue or tape paddle pop stick on one side to use as a handle
- Colour in, decorate, and glue on googly eyes
- Encourage discussion about what germs are and why it's important to wash our hands



Tuesday PM

wool germs

materials

- **For your germ craft, you'll need just a few materials:**
- **Embroidery Floss**
- **(We received ours from www.craftprojectideas.com.)**
- **Googly Eyes**
- **Glue**
- **Fork**
- **Scissors**

First, choose the colors of [Embroidery Floss](#) you want to use for your germs.

Next, create puff balls from the thread.

Simply use a fork to wrap the thread around and around the edges.

Tie the thread to one prong of the fork or just hold it in place with your thumb.

Then, wrap the thread around the prongs of the fork and until you have a a large puff.

Feel free to use a whole length of the thread.

Tie a small piece of floss around the middle in a knot. Slide the floss from the fork and snip the looped edges.

Fluff out your puff ball by lightly pulling at the threads.

Careful! The threads will pull right out of the pom pom if you pull too hard.

With scissors, snip any stray threads.

INGREDIENTS

MUFFINS:

- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1/2 cup whole wheat flour
- 1/2 cup granulated white sugar
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/3 cup vegetable or canola oil
- 1 large egg
- 1/3 cup milk
- 2 medium apples (peeled, cored & chopped)

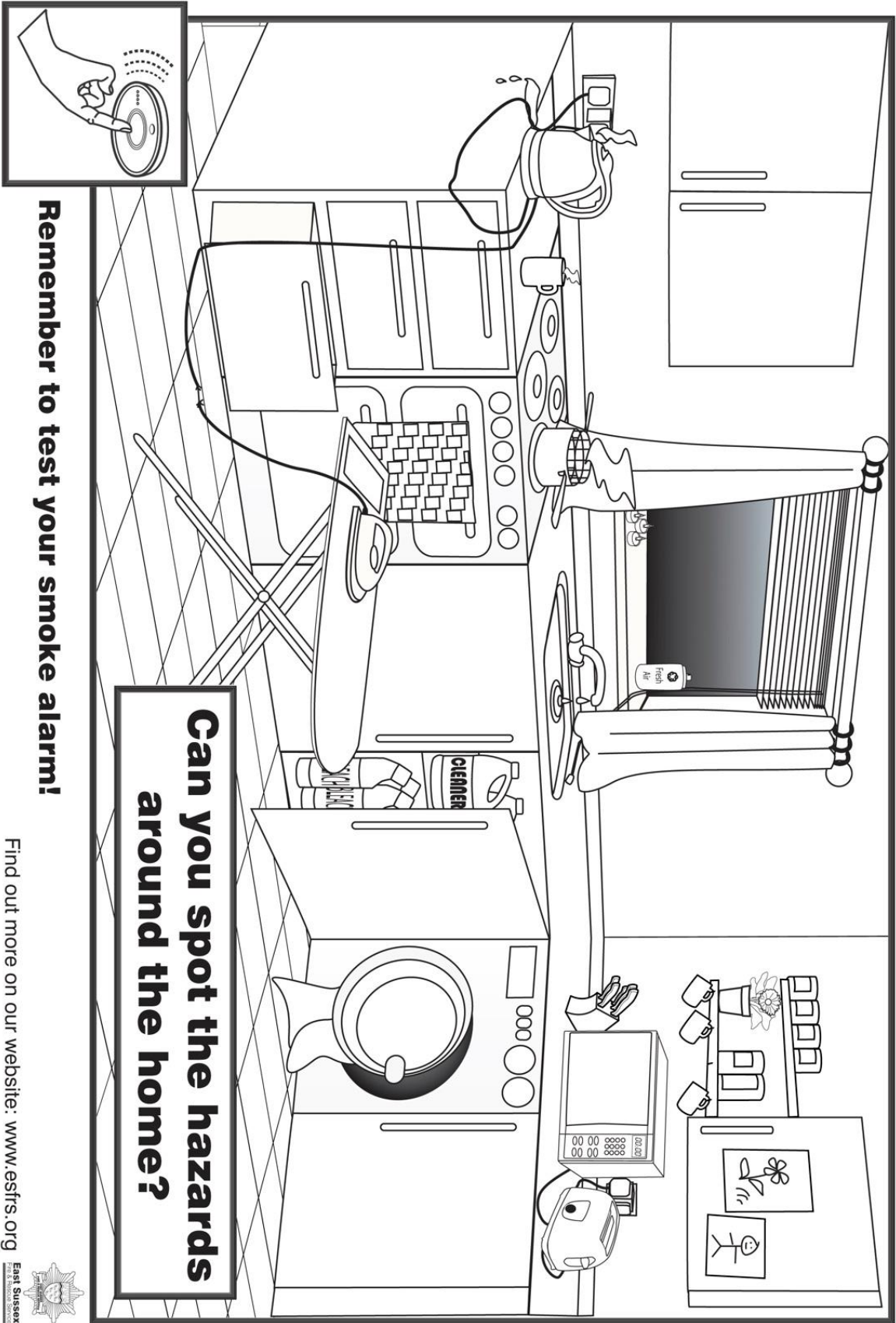
TOPPING:

- 1/4 cup granulated white sugar
- 2 tablespoons all purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons butter, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Preheat oven to 400°F. Grease a 12-cup muffin tin or line with paper muffin liners.
2. In a medium bowl whisk together dry ingredients. Add oil, egg and milk and stir just until combined. Fold in apples. Divide batter between the 12 muffin cups.
3. In a small bowl, mix topping ingredients, blending together with a pastry cutter or fork. Sprinkle over unbaked muffins.
4. Bake 15 to 20 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in center of muffin comes out clean.

- Talk to children about kitchen safety, helping to learn about unsafe things in the kitchen and how to be safe.

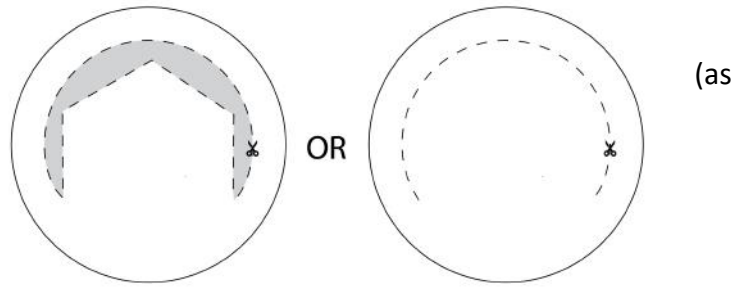
Firefighter helmets

Fire engine craft

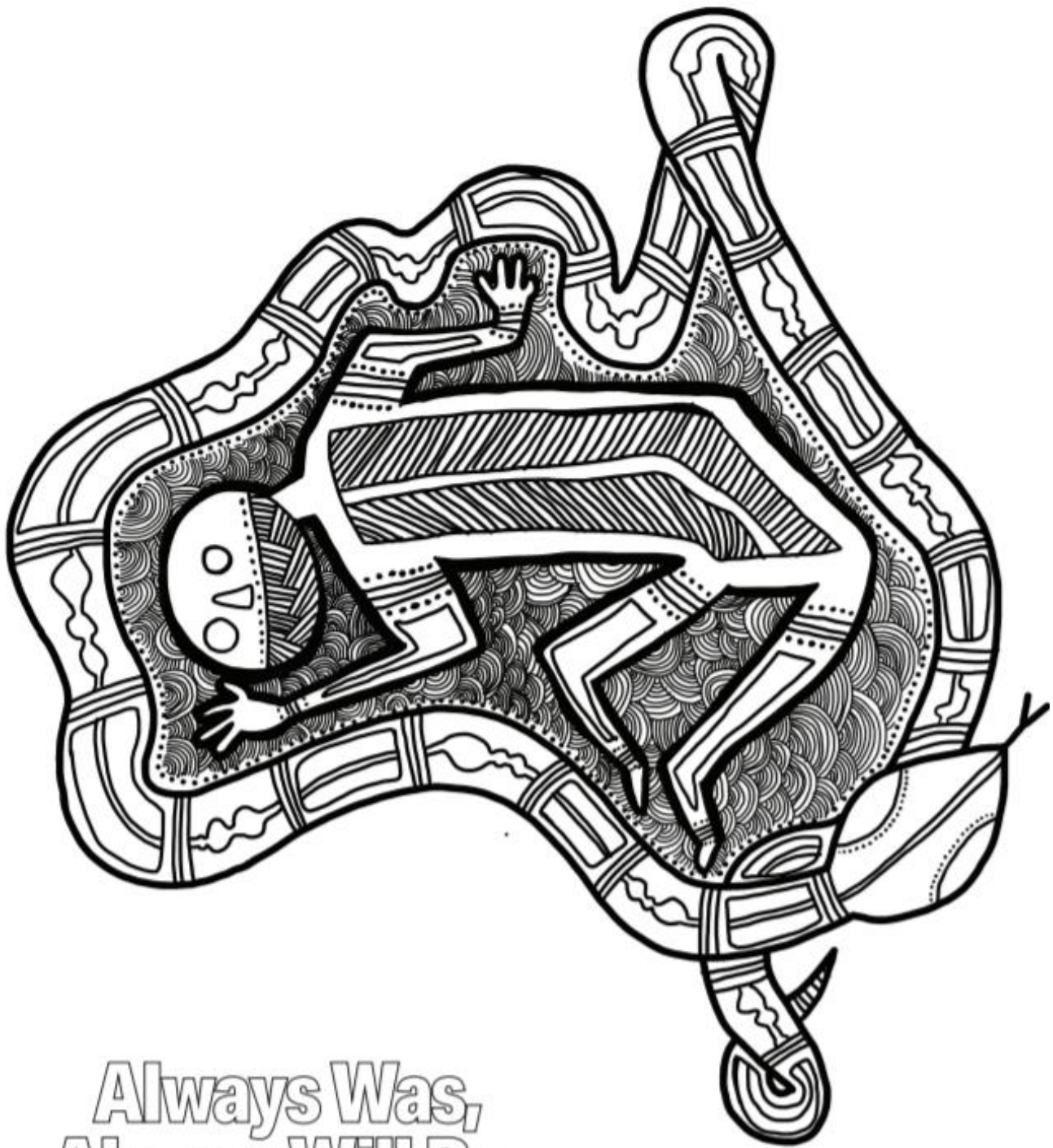


- paper plates

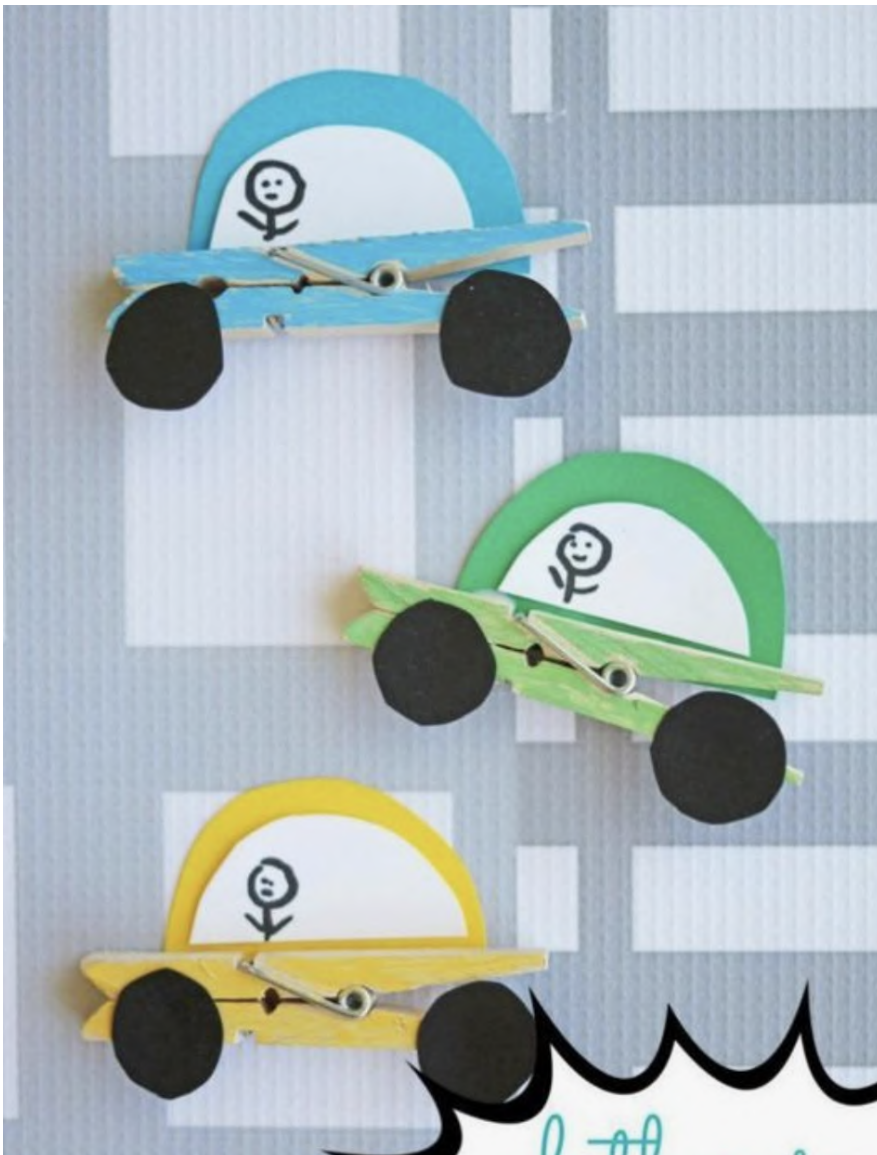

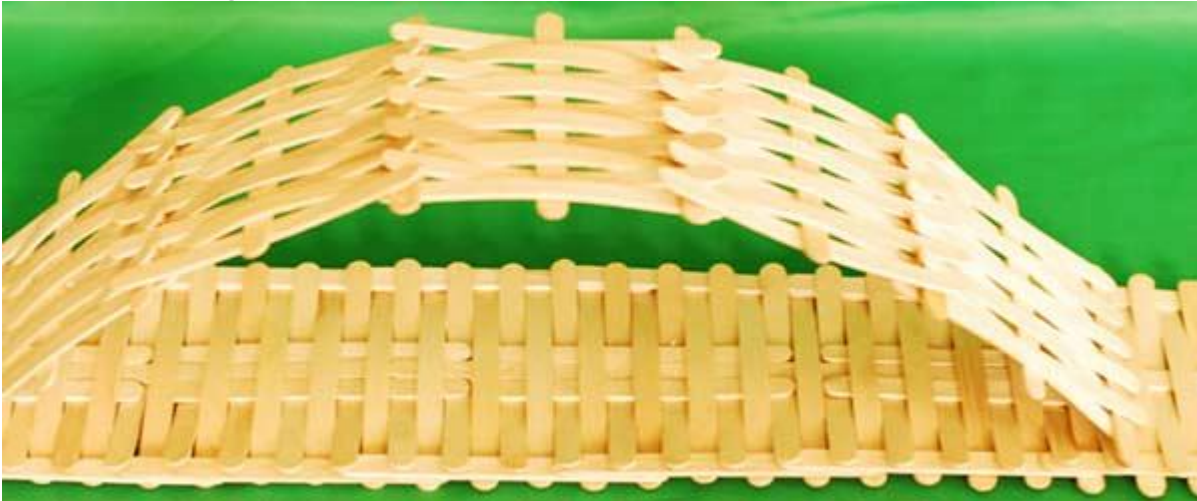
Instructions
