Monday PM

Pom Pom Christmas Tree

- Pom Pom
- Craft Stick
- Cardboard Piece
- Construction paper
- Red Ribbon
- Acrylic Paint (Gold)
- Gem Stickers | Buttons | Sequin
- Glue
- 1. Cut out a triangle shape from a green construction paper and glue it on a craft stick.
- 2. Cover the triangle paper with pom-poms. Alternatively, you
 - can hot glue the pom-poms directly in the shape of a triangular tree instead of gluing them on a paper.
- 3. Decorate the tree with jewel stickers or buttons or sequins if you like
- 4. Cut out a star shape from cardboard or coffee sleeves and color it with golden paint
- 5. After the paint dries, glue it on the top of the tree
- 6. Lastly, glue a red ribbon at the back to hang the ornament



Monday-Friday

(note: we need photos of all kids the week before printed out)

- 3 popsicle sticks per child
- brown card stock
- Yellow glittery card stock
- A piece of twine, approximately 6" long
- Hot glue gun
- Scissors and a craft/utility knife
- craft glue

- 1. Cut out a star from the glittery card stock
- 2. Cut the last inch off the 3rd popsicle stick
- 3. Add 2 drops of hot glue to the ends of the short popsicle stick
- 4. Then position the 2 long sticks to form a triangle, take a pice of twine and place the 2 ends of the twine at the tip of the triangle and hot glue them together
- 5. Using craft glue decorate the front and add on the star
- 6. Cut a small rectangle of brown paper and glue to the bottom of the tree.
- 7. Trace the outside lines of the triangle onto the kids photo and cut it out
- 8. Stick the photo to the the back of the tree.

Tuesday AM

Christmas Tree Thumbprint Art

- · White paper
- Coloured paper

- 1. Make a Christmas tree template from the coloured paper. Fold the paper in half and draw half of the Christmas tree.

Tuesday PM

Pipe cleaner candy canes

- 1 package (25 pc.) green chenille pipe cleaners, 12" x 6mm
- 1 package pony beads red, 6×9 mm
- 1 package pony beads white, 6×9 mm
- 1. Use wire cutters or old scissors to cut the pipe cleaners in half.
- 2. Slide one bead to the end of a pipe cleaner, turning the end around the bead to keep it in place. Alternate red and white beads until the pipe cleaner is full.
- 3. Turn the end around the last bead. Bend into a candy cane shape and hang on your tree.



Wednesday AM

Pom Pom Making

- · Wool
- Scissors
- Forks
- 1. Wrap the wool around the prongs of the fork about 50 times. Make sure you leave a slight gap at the bottom of the prongs as this will be needed in step 2.
- 2. Once the wool has been wrapped around the fork, trim it so it is no longer attached to the ball of wool. Then cut a piece of the same colour wool about 20cm long. Thread the end of this wool in between the two middle fork prongs underneath where you wrapped the wool in step 1.
- 3. Bring the end of the piece of wool that is behind the fork through the middle two prongs at the top and then tie in a knot with the other end of the wool. Make sure this knot is tied tightly as it will be what holds your pom pom together. Tie in a double knot to hold it in place.
- 4. Gently slide the wool off of the fork, then cut the loops on either side.
- 5. Trim the ends of the wool to make the pom pom more of a rounded circular shape.
- 6. If you want to hang your pom pom or attach it to something, make sure you leave the end of the wool that you tied the pom pom together with uncut. If you want the pom pom to be loose then trim this along with the other ends of the wool.



Wednesday PM

Christmas tree

- Paper plate (1 per tree)
- Clear tape
- Green paint
- Glue (either <u>school glue</u>, pva glue, or <u>Tacky Glue</u>)
- Multicolored pom poms*
- 1. Cut out ¼ of the paper plate
- 2. Roll the paper plate into a cone and secure using tape or staples
- 3. Paint the cone green

- popsicle sticks (4 sticks per snowflake)

- 1. Optional: pre hot glue the 4 craft sticks together
- 2. Either glue with the kids or use the premade snowflake shape

- 5. Repeat til decorated
- 6. Optional: tie a bit of string around the top of the snowflake (could hot glue to the back

Friday AM

Playdough

- · 2 cups plain flour
- · 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- · ½ cup salt
- · 2 tables cream of tatar
- 1 to 1.5 cups of boiling water
- Food colouring
- 1. Mix the flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil in a large mixing bowl
- 2. Add food colouring TO the boiling water then into the dry ingredients
- 3. Stir continuously until it becomes a sticky, combined dough
- 4. Allow it to cool down then take it out of the bowl and knead it vigorously for a couple of minutes until all of the stickiness has gone. * This is the most important part of the process, so keep at it until it's the perfect consistency!*
- 5. If it remains a little sticky then add a touch more flour until just right




Christmas Find A Words

Friday PM

- Colored cardstock (in light blue, green, brown and multicolor)
- Elmer's Glue
- Shaving cream
- Paintbrush
- Scissors
- 1. Make the homemade puffy paint by mixing equal parts



- shaving cream and Elmer's glue in a bowl. An 1/8 cup of each was more than enough to cover 2 snowglobes. You'll know it's the perfect consistency when it looks like marshmallow fluff.
- 2. Cut out the pieces such as the tree, the baubles, the star and the base.
- 3. Use a small hole punch (I used a .5" one) to make ornaments from colored cardstock to use on the tree.
- 4. Glue the large blue circle behind the brown base to make the snowglobe.
- 5. Position the green triangles to make the pine tree and add the ornaments and star to the top.
- 6. Use your paintbrush to brush on puffy paint snow onto the bottom of the snowglobe.
- 7. Dab the puffy paint all over the snowglobe to make snow flurries.
- 8. Let dry completely.
